Harmony Day Wednesday 21 March 2018: Since 1999, Harmony Day has been an Australian Government initiative. It is managed by the Department of Social Services. Harmony Day is celebrated on 21 March each year and allows schools to celebrate our cohesive, culturally diverse society and promote inclusiveness, respect and a sense of belonging for everyone. Harmony Day coincides with the United Nation's International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination. The theme for Harmony Day 2018 is "Racism. No Way!" A lot has been written about not getting to school too early, however, there is another side. Student Attendance

Student attendance and punctuality is important and helps to ensure students continue to learn as best they can. In line with our own school targets for school attendance:

Parents will be involved in the following ways:

When a student is absent for three consecutive days and the school has not been contacted, the classroom teacher will phone parent/carer to determine the reason for the absence.

; If an absence remains unexplained 5 school days after the child has returned to school, the classroom teacher will send home a request that the absence/s be explained.

We seek your assistance in improving attendance outcomes for our students and with them, learning outcomes.

Exemption from Attendance

In the case of students of compulsory school age, applications for student leave in excess of fifteen days in a twelve month period must be considered as applications for exemption from school attendance. Parents must make written application, via the school.

New School Fence

Over the coming weeks work will commence on our new security fence. A temporary fence will be set up. Work is expected to take a few weeks. We will talk to students about safe pedestrian behaviour during this time but please discuss with your child the importance of slowing down and taking note of the changing environment during this time. Emphasise and model the safest place to cross the busy roads around our school are at the lights and the crossing. Please talk about being careful around the IGA carpark as I have noticed an increase in traffic since returning to school this year.

Going on a family holiday

It is always preferred that families take their holidays during the designated vacation dates. If this can not happen, schools may record leave for students who have provided an explanation of the absence as being due to travel in Australia and overseas which has been accepted by the principal. The 'L' code will be used. 'L' standing for leave.

An Application for Extended Leave – Travel should be completed by the parent and provided to the principal in cases of extended absence due to travel with family such as family holiday. Leave is included as absence for statistical purposes.

Exemptions cannot be granted retrospectively.
