Principal's Report - Craig Brown

Dear Parents and Carers,

We have had a few staffing changes since our last newsletter. Mr Francis, our Deputy Principal, is currently acting as the Principal of Toongabbie East Public School until the end of this term. Mr Sanders and Mrs Bownds are sharing the responsibility of the Deputy Principal's role but will still be supervising their respective stages. Mr Tuck is relieving as Assistant Principal until the end of term and will have additional responsibilities for technology and student wellbeing. In addition to these changes, Miss Tulich, the wonderful teacher of KT was appointed as a permanent teacher to Chatswood Public School starting term 2. The parents of KT have been notified and I am working through the staffing changes with the executive at present. I will provide information when things are finalised. We are currently in the process of employing an Assistant Principal to replace Mrs Sullivan who recently retired.

A huge thank you to our wonderful group of band parents who ran the 'Democracy Sausage Sizzle' on Saturday. The event was very successful and showed how our community can get behind a cause and have fun doing it. I believe just over \$2000 was raised . This money will go towards supporting our school band program and keeping costs down for parents. The committee will be hosting the next BBQ when we find out the date for the Federal Election. Thank you to all those who voted at our school and supported this event.

This week we are painting the old computer room and Bicentennial Room. The P&C have donated funds to support the development of a Technology Hub in our school. We are engaging an expert in coding and robotics for next term to work with our teachers and students. All students will get five sessions in this new learning space as we aim to develop their technology skills.

I hope our runners are busy training up for the School Cross Country. This takes place on April 10 and is always a great day. Mr Howe is in charge of this event and will also manage the zone carnival. He is experienced and will put on a wonderful event for our students. We know that all students are not runners and encourage everyone to participate by either running to their potential and cheering on their house.

Stage 1 have been off to the Field of Mars Study Centre this week. Sounds like another planet, however, it is just down the road at Ryde and looks at environmental issues. It was great to see the students get on the bus so excited and return with lots of interesting stories. Teachers praised the behaviour of our students and their fitness when completing the long trek.

Students from Years 3 and 5 are completing 'NAPLAN Online" practice at the moment. The official NAPLAN Online testing will be completed in Week 3 next term. The dates are May 14-24. I would like to thank Mr Tuck who is looking after the technology involved with supporting this program.

Tonight is Movie Night at Toongabbie Public School and I hope to see you all there for 'The Incredibles 2' We have the Pedlar's Parade on Thursday morning and the End of Term Disco on Friday Night. It looks like another busy week as we come to the last 10 days of term.

I will ask the teachers to follow up on any outstanding absent notes and remind parents of how important good attendance is to achieve the best possible results. Finally a big thank you to our students for looking so good last Thursday on School Photo Day. I have seen the proofs and our students look smart!

NAPLAN Online

NAPLAN assesses literacy and numeracy – important skills that each child needs to succeed in school and life. The NAPLAN tests are designed to help us make sure students are on track with their literacy and numeracy development. Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in NAPLAN tests for reading, writing, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.

This week most year 3 and 5 students will have had the opportunity to participate in a practice test for NAPLAN online. If they have not, it will be in the upcoming week. Between Monday 13 May and Friday 24 May our school will participate in NAPLAN Online. Students do not need to be computer experts to take the NAPLAN test online. Making sure students have computer skills is part of our school curriculum, and our teachers will ensure your child is familiar with the online format. VISITORS—Sign In/Sign Out

Department of Education requires all visitors to the school to present to the office on arrival and sign in and once completing the visit you need to sign out.
