Welcome Back

We have started two new programs this week that I am sure will engage our students. The first is the K-6 Athletics Development program. The second is a coding and robotics program, which is an initiative fully funded by the school. Every class will be participating in five sessions over the term. This is in line with our commitment to enhancing both our students' and staffs' skills in this important area. All students in Years 3 and 5 will take part in NAPLAN testing at our school over weeks 3 and 4. Students are assessed in the areas of reading, writing, language conventions and numeracy. This year the students will be completing the testing online (except for Yr 3 Writing). We have a team of teachers working to make sure everything goes smoothly. The students have already completed a practise session last term. While it is a great way to gauge how your child is performing in relation to all students in Australia, it is important to remember that it is one test on one day. Please don't place too much pressure on your child but ensure that they do get a good night's rest and a hearty breakfast on each of the days.

Uniform Change

As you can see, the weather is quite changeable at the moment. Health Care Plans

We are currently in the process of reviewing and updating the Health Care Plans of those students who have been identified as having a medical condition. Health Care Plans are reviewed annually to ensure that medical conditions, treatments and Doctor contacts are up-to-date. If your child currently has a Health Care Plan, you will be asked to review the existing plan and return this to school with any amendments. If your child has a medical condition that our school is unaware of, and which requires the development of a School Care Plan, please notify our School Office as soon as possible. Your support in returning these documents promptly is appreciated.

Nationally consistent collection of data on school students with disability - 2019

Our school is participating in the collection of nationally consistent data on school students with a disability. We will be collecting information already available in the school about the support that is being provided to students with a disability. Better data will help the Government plan for students with disability. The data collection will have no direct impact on your child and they will not be involved in any testing process.

The NSW Department of Education will provide data to the Australian Government from all NSW public schools in such a way that no individual student or school will be able to be identified. In this way, we will ensure the privacy and confidentiality of all students.

All information is protected by privacy laws which regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information. Family Court Orders or Apprehended Violence Orders

Sadly sometimes relationships break down and the court makes orders that change the contact parents can have with their children or the role they play in making decisions about their children's education. These can be Family Court Orders or Apprehended Violence Orders. If this happens it is important that you provide the school with a copy of any court orders that could impact on your child's education.

In the absence of any notification to the contrary, the school will assume that both parents continue to retain a shared and equal parental responsibility for their children and should be involved in making any decisions regarding their children's education. This means that the school will recognise that each parent has equal duties, obligations, responsibilities and opportunities in relation to matters involving the school.

Fundamental principles underpinning the Department's response to family law matters that impact on the school

- 1. School is not the place for family disputes to be resolved. Nor should school staff resolve such issues.
- 2. For children who are facing difficult family circumstances, school should be a safe haven into which family problems do not intrude.

If any changes occur in your family relationships which have the potential to impact on the relationship between the school and your family, please advise the school immediately and provide a copy of any court orders that may be obtained. These orders will be stored securely and only accessed by staff who need to see them in order to plan for your children's learning and support and related issues.

Opportunity Class Placement

Opportunity classes cater for highly achieving academically gifted students who may otherwise be without classmates at their own academic and social level. These schools help gifted and talented students to learn by grouping them with other gifted and talented students, teaching them in specialised ways and providing educational materials at the appropriate level. The application process for Year 5 opportunity class placement in 2020 is now open.

Applications for opportunity class placement are considered mainly on the basis of the Opportunity Class Placement Test results and school assessment scores. The Opportunity Class Placement Test will be held on Wednesday 31 July 2019.

If you have a child in Year 4 and you would like them to apply for placement in an Opportunity Class for Year 5 2020, please return your *Intention to Apply* note that will be sent home next week. You will need to apply on the internet using a valid email address. Important dates in the application process are as follows:

- * Tuesday 30 April 2019: Online applications open
- * Friday 17 May 2019: Online applications close (Parents and carers must apply by the due date.)
- * Wednesday 31 July 2019: Opportunity Class Placement Test
