Principal's Report

Dear Parents and Carers.

I start this newsletter with important information. As you are probably aware, industrial action has been called for by the Teachers' Federation on Tuesday 7 December. I have sent out with this newsletter information provided from the Department of Education. As a result of the strike our school will be providing minimal supervision of students on Tuesday. This means the cohort arrangements that have been in place this term will not be in operation. However, our school will still operate in a COVID-safe manner in accordance with NSW Health guidelines.

It's been another busy fortnight at TPS. Reports are now being finalised and will be sent out to parents via email on Thursday 9 December. The school does not hold formal whole school parent/teacher interviews in the last week, but parents are welcome to contact the teacher if they have any concerns or questions. A process is in place to share information between your child's teacher and their teacher for 2022 to ensure continuity of learning. The reports this year will not have grades due to the lengthy period of remote learning. They will provide information on achievements and future directions.

This week we held elections for our student leaders for 2022. The students did a great job presenting their speeches and I congratulate all who participated. The students who were successful in gaining a leadership position are; Daniel Burki, Max Clifton, Xavier Parsons, Max Sinclair, Adithya Anand, Akshayaa Mahes, Ebony Tai, Emily Puckey, Saisha Mehta and Ellie Oldfield. The school captains and vice-captains for 2022 will be announced at the Stage 3 Presentation Assembly on Wednesday.

We have only nine days of school remaining for students. The next two weeks will be a busy time. We have our final

Deputy Principal's Report

COVID Symptoms and absences

In accordance with advice from NSW Health, parents and carers are reminded NOT to send children to school if they are unwell, even if they have the mildest flu-like symptoms. The school will make arrangements for any students showing any symptoms to be collected. NSW Health have requested that schools encourage anyone who has even mild flu-like symptoms, to arrange to be tested through their local medical practitioner or one of the COVID-19 clinics. Symptoms include:

- Fever
- Cough
- Sore or scratchy throat
- Shortness of breath
- Runny Nose
- · Loss of smell/taste

Other reported symptoms include fatigue, acute blocked nose, muscle pain, joint pain, headache, diarrhoea, nausea/vomiting, loss of appetite, unexplained chest pain and conjunctivitis. Students with flu-like symptoms will need to provide a copy of a negative COVID-19 test result before being permitted to return to school. We ask that you please forward results to the office at school. Please DO NOT send to the class teacher. When completing an absence note we kindly ask that you please be specific in terms of reasons, if only 'unwell' or 'sick' is noted the school will need to contact you for further information. Parents are also reminded that students should not return until symptom free, regardless of whether they require a COVID test or not.

Bike, Road and Carpark Safety

Students who ride to and from school are reminded of the importance of keeping safe whilst on their bikes. If your child rides to and from school, please reiterate the message of remaining alert, careful and to slow down on blind corners and intersections. If you drive your child to and from school, please think twice about completing u-turns near the school zone. It goes without saying that the safety and welfare of our students is our top priority. A key danger that young children face is from cars. A further reminder that the carpark may only be used by school staff and contractors between 8am and 4pm daily. Thank you for helping keep our students safe. Parramatta Council has let us know council rangers may be patrolling the school zones. Teachers are continuing this conversation regularly with students.

This will be our final meeting for 2021. On the agenda at this meeting, we will be hearing the final monthly reports from the school executive, our P&C sub-committees and Canteen as well as discussing some forward planning for 2022.

Please also be aware, that our P&C Annual General Meeting will be held early in Term 1, 2022. The date for this meeting will be advised in the final newsletter for this year.

At the AGM there will be the election of the 2022 P&C Executive and relevant sub-committee positions, there may be opportunities for members to vote on issues relating to how the P&C operates.
