### Students Leaving Toongabbie

If your child/children are not returning to Toongabbie in 2023, not including Year 6 students, could you please let the school know in writing as soon as possible.

### Procedure For Requesting Leave

I would like to remind parents and carers of the correct procedure for applying for leave during the school term. This should be done in writing, either by email or letter, requesting leave including the dates of absence and the reason. If the student will be away for more than a week, a form needs to be completed. This is sent home once the request is received. Correspondence stating that "my child will be absent from school" is not appropriate. The letter should say "I request leave for my child". Please note that the Department of Education has revised its Policy & Procedure on School Attendance. Holidays taken by a student outside of school holiday periods will now be included as Absences.

### E Sun Smart

As the school year enters its final weeks and the weather warms, students and teachers naturally gravitate to spending more time outdoors. It's therefore a timely reminder to protect your skin and teach your children about being sun smart. Teaching children from an early age about how to protect their skin from the sun and UV radiation can reduce their risk of developing skin cancers later in life. Understanding the UV index, and checking it daily, lets you know when to protect your skin from the sun's UV radiation. UV levels are high enough (UV 3 or above) to damage unprotected skin most months of the year and can be present even on cool and cloudy days. This means that sun protection might be needed even when the sun isn't visible. Remember to protect yourself and help students to protect their skin by wearing a broadbrimmed hat, wearing sun protective clothing that covers as much of the skin as possible, and sunscreen on exposed skin, wearing sunglasses and finding shade whenever possible when outside.
